FLEX Update: New Promo Video


Have you noticed Devin Zagar of 7 Foot Productions at some of our recent FLEX events? He is gathering footage for a new video promoting our group.

Devin is a FLEX member and his business provides services like videography, photography, 3D tours, social media marketing, and website design.




